From the Co-Founders



Dear Friends,

As the Co-Founders of the Sustainable Procurement Pledge (SPP), Thomas Udesen and Bertrand Conqueret, we are humbled and inspired by the collective determination of procurement professionals worldwide to accelerate positive change across supply chains.

Our vision for SPP is clear: convene one million procurement professionals globally by 2030 and embed sustainable procurement practices in all supply chains worldwide. This audacious goal was sparked by the urgency expressed by young leaders, like Greta Thunberg, and the transformative power of the United Nations Global Compact.

The SPP journey began in 2019 with a simple LinkedIn post – a video inviting others to join us in building a movement for sustainable procurement. The response was

overwhelming and the demand from the community was immense. In the first three years, the initiative grew into a fully volunteer-led movement that unified our community under the SPP banner. In the last year, we are proud to have expanded the SPP team with the appointment of Melissa de Roquebrune as Executive Director, bringing renewed focus and commitment.

To date we have seen over 12,000 ambassadors join SPP, the formation of the League of Champions and Transformational Panel, and the launch of 18 global Chapters focused on regional, topic-specific and industry initiatives. Our World Sustainable Procurement Day event (WSPD) has now become an annual celebration, symbolising hope and renewal.

The impact of SPP has been profound –

with an overwhelming majority of our community reporting positive influence from their participation with SPP. Our two-pillar strategy – ‘Close the Gaps’ – both empowers and equips procurement professionals and encourages leadership to embed sustainable practices.

Today, we call upon you to take action. **Sign the Sustainable Procurement Pledge** and invite your procurement network to join the SPP community. Together, we can create a powerful force for change and leave a positive legacy.

We envision a future where one million procurement professionals have signed the Pledge, and the SPP remains a driving force for positive change.

We are deeply grateful for the support received, and with renewed vigor, we stand united for sustainable impact.

Through the League of Champions and Transformational Panel we engage leaders from 20 (and counting) companies who are committed to sharing best practice for the benefit of the whole SPP

community. Volunteers, including the Steering Team, and Supporters & Friends help to deliver SPP's strategic objectives alongside the Global Team and the dedicated Co-Founders.

To support our community on their sustainability journey, we equip them by sharing content through events, networking and other activities. As the content starts outgrowing our existing platforms, we are committed to providing engagement experiences to facilitate even more sharing of knowledge, collaboration and learning in the SPP community going forward.

As SPP continues to grow, we recognize the value of the interdependent relationships we can foster with the wider sustainability ecosystem. We strive to build impactful engagements with stakeholders worldwide to grow stronger together and respond to shared challenges with pace and ambition.

The Ambassadors

The world is facing tremendous environmental and social challenges. Procurement professionals have a critical role to contribute, to steer and to develop responsible supply chains. SPP is aimed at all procurement professionals, academics and students who want to become an Ambassador for sustainable procurement practices across global supply chains.

Our goal is to attract one million Ambassadors by 2030 and we are well on our way with 12,000 individuals already signed-up. In 2022 we asked our Ambassador community about the impact of their engagement with SPP.

The Sustainable Procurement Pulse survey was conducted in collaboration with Gartner. This annual survey provides valuable insights on the state of sustainable procurement, how well SPP meets our Ambassadors' expectations and identifies areas for improvement.

The SPP Chapters are organized by regional, industries and topics. They facilitate practical discussions about procurement challenges and solutions led by topic experts and practitioners, to inspire and empower individuals to overcome barriers they might be facing in their day-to-day operations.

All SPP Ambassadors are encouraged to join Chapters of their interest and benefit from online and in-person events, networking, and exchange of resources, tools and learnings.

Our Chapters are led by volunteer Co-Chairs, passionate professionals who bring valuable knowledge in their respective areas. We extend our continued gratitude to our Co-Chairs for their leadership and engagement and welcome suggestions and proposals for new Chapters from our Ambassador community. Here are a few highlights from this year's Chapter activities.

SCOPE 3

Gaining transparency and managing the measurement of upstream and downstream emissions in a supply chain is a challenge that all companies no matter size, location or industry are facing. The Scope 3 Chapter has run a **series of online events** that invite specialists and leader in the area of emission management to share best practices and provide practical tips and tools for others to control their Scope 3 emissions.

SUPPLIER DIVERSITY

The Supplier Diversity & Inclusion Chapter focuses on the many possible ways of promoting diversity in the supply chain. The benefits of wider diversity and inclusion is consistently recognized as a critical factor by global frameworks such as the Sustainable Development Goals. The activities of this group has received impressive external recognition in the wider sustainability community and has been invited to join the project submission for the EU Commission "**Buy Social Europe**"

GERMANY

The **SPP Germany Chapter** has established a wide network of procurement professionals from diverse backgrounds; large companies, small and medium entities, science, research, media and NGOs. Their aim is 'to create a stage for knowledge' and they do a fantastic job of sharing the latest trends whether it be from panel discussions to newly published books.

PUBLIC PROCUREMENT

A key topic area for procurement professionals that is interwoven with systemic change. This **Chapter** looks at how governments and state-owned enterprises buy goods and services. These buying processes are usually led with intricate Request for Proposals (RFP's), which are a powerful tool to ingrain social and environmental aspects of the procurement process.



PHARMA

Since its formation, this group looks to develop a pharma specific approach for sustainable procurement that covers decarbonization strategy, data methods and collaboration. It is a space that proactively invites different sizes of companies from the industry to exchange ideas together. A key highlight of the last 12 months has seen this Chapter collaborating with our Scope 3 Chapter to offer valuable joint learnings.

SINGAPORE

Singapore is the second-busiest port in the world and regional headquarters for many businesses in ASEAN/APAC. Given its prominence, many senior supply chain leaders are based in the country and it has become one of our most active Chapters. In the space of only a few months, this Chapter has run three in-person events, each attracting over 100 attendees. The **Chapter** looks to harness the country's ambitious sustainability goals and strong sense of community, which mean it is well-placed to drive positive procurement change across multiple tiers of global supply chains.

League of Champions and Transformational Panel



Launched at the end of 2021, the SPP Champions Program has been a significant driver of SPP's mission in 2022/23.

Designed for organizations committed to championing sustainable procurement and help their teams to accelerate the adoption of sustainable procurement practices across global supply chains, the Champions Programs has grown from initially eight to 20 companies in its first year. The SPP Champions program convenes like-minded companies united in wanting to engage their procurement divisions with the SPP movement as a tool to deliver the organization's sustainability objectives.

The members of the SPP Champions Program not only engage their procurement leadership and members of their team in the SPP community but support SPP with annual donations that empower us to scale our plans, implement the key elements of our strategy, grow and strengthen the SPP community and build a Global Team. Ultimately, they help by empowering SPP and the community to reach its ambitious goal.

Thomas Udesen, Chief Procurement Officer at Bayer and SPP Co-Founder, explains: "In numerous conversations with leading CPOs, we recognized a strong desire to collaborate across organizations, and to involve the entire procurement team in SPP. At the same time, we recognize that we can only achieve our growth goal of welcoming one million procurement professionals as SPP Ambassadors by 2030 if we develop scalable engagement programs. That is how the idea of the SPP Champions was born."

The Champions Program engages the organizations' CPOs and Vice Presidents in the League of Champions who are collaborating on the future of sustainable procurement leadership and working together to offer support for other leaders.

Those tasked with embedding sustainability in procurement and capacity-strengthening teams across their organization join the Transformational Panel. They exchange ideas on the practical challenges and successes in implementing sustainable practices,

collaborating on how to drive change and working together to support others on the same journey.

This year we welcomed more than 80 industry leaders and experts to our virtual stage to share their knowledge on sustainable procurement practices.

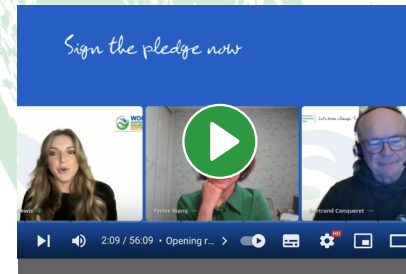
